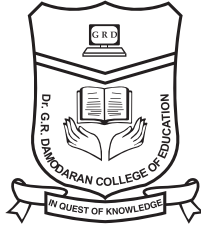

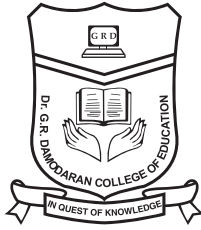

THE MISSION OF A VISIONARY

Established by **The GRD Trust**, in the year **2005**, the **Dr. G.R. DAMODARAN COLLEGE OF EDUCATION** has emerged as yet another memorial to **Prof. G.R. Damodaran (1914 - 1986)**, one of the great Educational visionaries and Institution builders of our Country. Over a period of four decades, totally dedicated to the cause of Education especially in the fields of Science, Engineering, Technology and Management, **Prof. G.R. Damodaran** made unparalleled contributions to Educational development both in terms of quantitative and qualitative aspects even while nurturing the **PSG group of Institutions** as one among the outstanding Centres of Excellence in the Country. He made pioneering efforts for reorganising and developing Engineering and Management Education at the all India level, as the Chairman of several Committees and Boards constituted by the Government of India and, at the regional level, as Chairman of the **Southern Regional Committee** of the **All India Council for Technical Education**. During his Tenure of Membership of the **Lok Sabha** and the **Tamilnadu Legislative Council** spanning over two decades and during his **Vice-Chancellorship** of the **Composite University of Madras**, **Prof. G.R. Damodaran** served the cause of Educational Development at all levels with rare dedication, commitment and outstanding creativity.

TWO YEAR **B.Ed.** DEGREE PROGRAMME (SEMESTER PATTERN UNDER CBCS)

Duration of the Programme

The B.Ed. programme is a two-year Course structured under the Semester System, comprising **four Semesters**. Each Semester consists of **100 working days**, with **36 instructional hours per week**, distributed over five or six working days. The overall duration excludes the time allotted for admissions and examinations.

Curriculum of the Programme

The B.Ed. curriculum offers a comprehensive professional training for aspiring teachers. It comprises **fourteen compulsory theory courses** and **one elective course chosen from six options**. A key component of the programme is '**Engagement with the Field**,' which includes **School Internship, Enhancing Professional Capacities (EPC) courses, and an online course** to strengthen digital learning and professional skills.

Eligibility Criteria for The Two B.Ed Degree Programme

Candidates must compulsorily complete the **10+2+3 (15 years)** or the **11+1+3 (15 years)** pattern of study and passed the qualifying examination conducted by the **State Board, CBSE, or any other recognized Board**. They should also hold a **UG degree** from a **UGC-recognized University** in one of the **School subjects approved by the Directorate of School Education** at the secondary or higher secondary level.

- ❖ **Content for the Preparation:**
 - ✓ **Theoretical Inputs:** Based on the knowledge gained from reading and reflecting on texts.
 - ✓ **Practical Experiences:** Includes activities related to drama, art, and teaching-learning processes.
 - ✓ **Critical Understanding of ICT:** Focuses on the use of **Information and Communication Technology (ICT)** for effective teaching and learning.
 - ✓ **Self-Reflection:** Involves understanding and assessing one's own strengths and weaknesses.

These records reflect the integration of the theory, practical experience, and self-assessment to enhance the professional capabilities of student teachers.

1. Attendance

- ❖ A Minimum of 85% attendance is required to appear for the examinations.
- ❖ 75% attendance is accepted only based on medical proof and the University approval.
- ❖ Absence for 10+ continuous days may lead to cancellation of the admission.
- ❖ Students securing 40%-70% attendance may rejoin within 2 years after remitting the full fee.
- ❖ Students with low attendance are not eligible for scholarships or financial aid.

2. Examination

Each semester includes **three formative assessments** (50 marks each) and **two model examinations** (70 marks each), conducted as per the University pattern. The **internal marks** will be awarded by the College based on the performance in these assessments and examinations.

3. Practical Examination

The **Third Semester practical examination** is based on the Student's performance during the **80 working days of the school internship**, along with the completion of **Practical works, Records, Instructional materials, Teaching competency, EPC records, and Proof of completion of the Online Course.**

16-WEEK SCHOOL INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME AND OBSERVATION

As per TNTEU norms, all Student-teachers must complete a **16-week school internship**. This internship is guided by school teachers and includes:

- ❖ Classroom observation
- ❖ Teaching practice
- ❖ Preparing and conducting tests for the Students
- ❖ Developing lesson plans, instructional materials, and maintaining EPC records
- ❖ Providing the proof of completion of an online course

All necessary arrangements for the internship will be made by the College in collaboration with selected schools and the CEO.

Note: *Teacher educators of our College will visit the trainees at each collaborated school once every ten days during the 16-week internship programme.*

INSTRUCTIONS FOR TEACHING PRACTICE

During the 16-week internship, student-teachers must actively engage in all school activities under the guidance of school mentors and college faculty.

Key Expectations

- ❖ **Report regularly** and maintain punctuality by signing the attendance register every day.
- ❖ **Treat the school as your workplace**, working under the Head of the School's supervision.
- ❖ **Maintain cordial relationships** with Guide Teachers and follow their instructions.
- ❖ **Prepare and teach lessons** through approved plans and suitable teaching aids.
- ❖ **Assist in daily school tasks**, exams, library work, and co-curricular activities.
- ❖ **Reflect on your teaching**, discuss observations with mentors, and maintain records.
- ❖ **Seek leave formally**, with valid reasons and documents submitted through the proper channels.
- ❖ **Be professional** in conduct, appearance, and communication at all times.
- ❖ **Report any issues** to the School and the College authorities promptly.
- ❖ **Respect the school's rules** and contribute positively to its functioning.

Code of Conduct for Student-Teachers

- ❖ Teach based on professionalism and ethics.
- ❖ Work under the guidance of the Guide Teacher.
- ❖ Be well-prepared with the subject content.
- ❖ Follow the school's timetable and instructions.
- ❖ Dress modestly and maintain a neat appearance.
- ❖ Handle classes with dignity and discipline.

LIBRARY

LIBRARY TIMINGS

The library will be open on all working days between 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Students may borrow books at that time.

LIBRARY RULES

- ❖ **Membership:** All enrolled Students are members of the library unless disqualified.
- ❖ **Library Cards:** Each card allows one book; non-transferable. Lost/damaged cards incur a Rs. 175 fine.
- ❖ **Silence:** Maintain strict silence in the library.
- ❖ **Personal Belongings:** Deposit personal belongings before entering.
- ❖ **ID Requirement:** Show ID and library card to borrow books.
- ❖ **No Distractions:** No loud talks or disturbing activities will be allowed.
- ❖ **Care of Books:** Students are responsible for the book's condition and will be fined for damages.
- ❖ **Requesting Books:** Ask the Librarian for books from closed cupboards.
- ❖ **Issue Register:** Books must be logged in the issue register.
- ❖ **Reference Books:** Use only in the library.
- ❖ **Book Damage:** No underlining or damaging; Rs. 300 fine per page will be levied.
- ❖ **Check Book Condition:** Report any damage immediately to the Librarian.
- ❖ **Late Return:** Rs. 4/day fine for overdue books.
- ❖ **End of Year Return:** Return books 2 days before the academic year ends.
- ❖ **Clearance:** No certificates or refunds would be considered without returning the books and clearing the dues.
- ❖ **Sub-lending:** Do not sub-lend library books at any cause.
- ❖ **Lost Books:** Replace lost books or remit the replacement cost and a fine.
