Historical Background and Institutional Principles

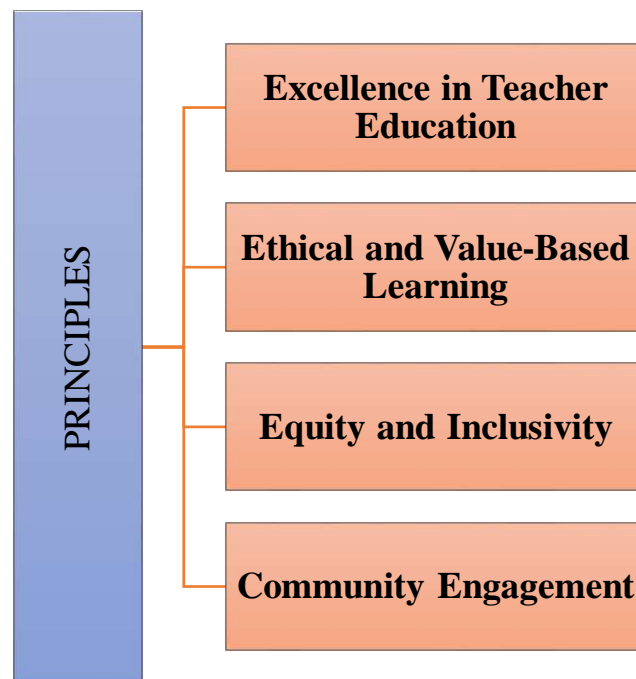

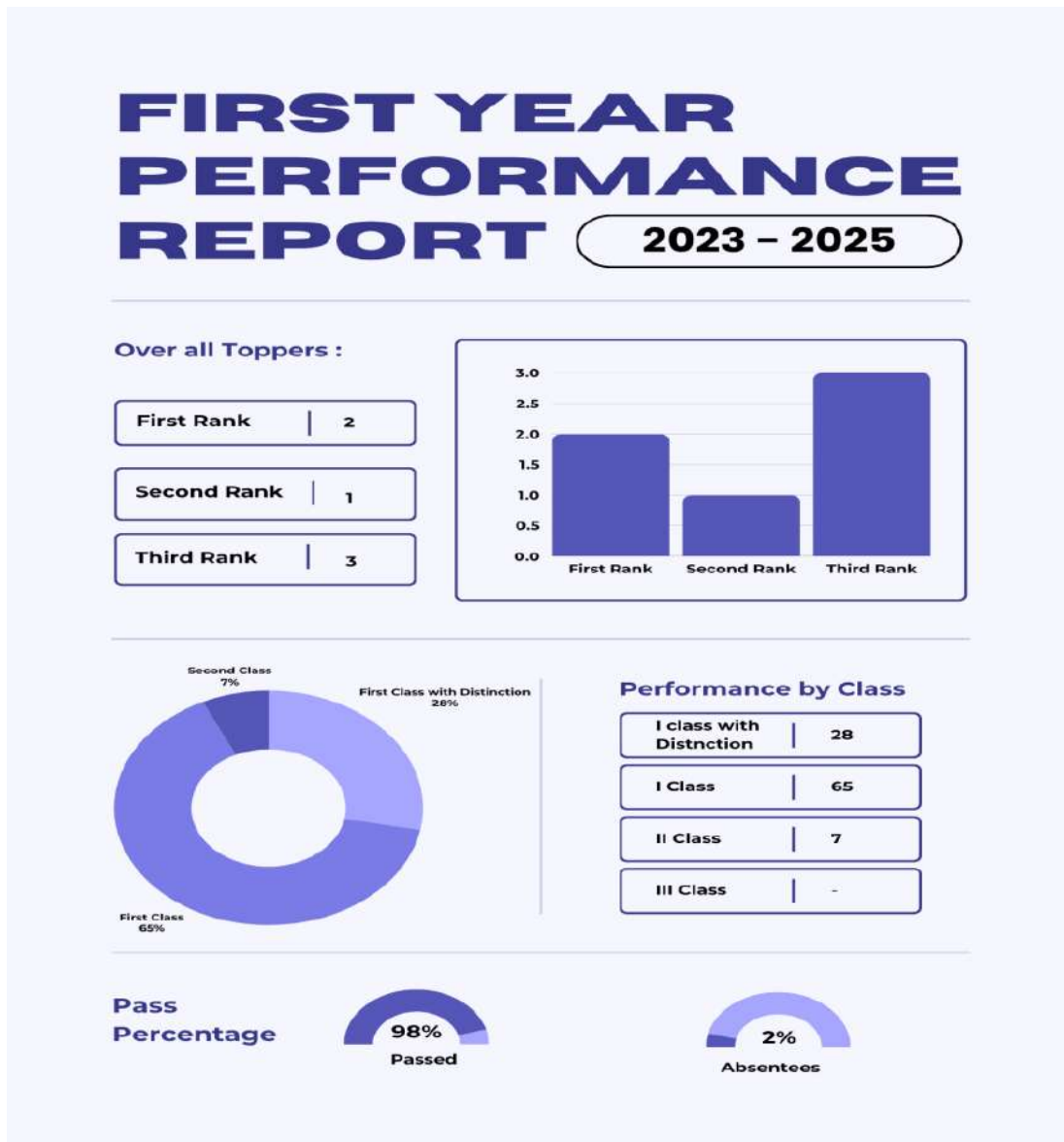
- **Staff Quarters Renovation:**

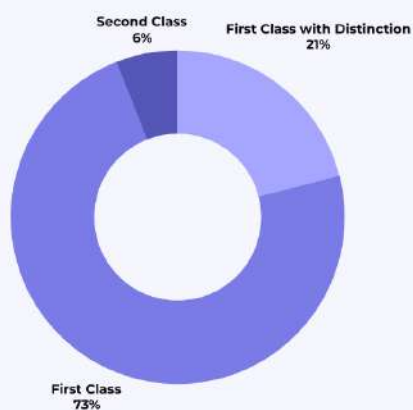

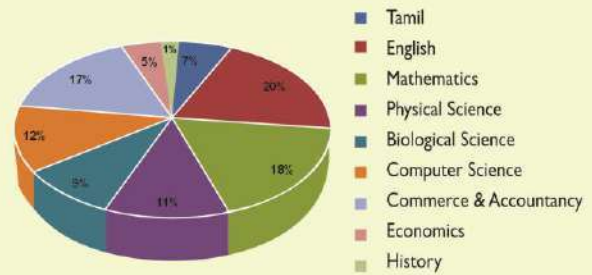

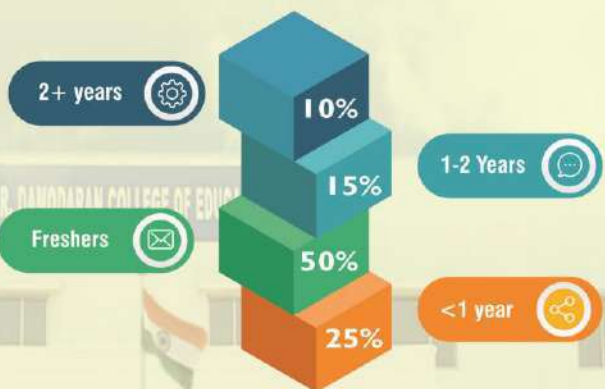
