The Examination Committee of the College met on 7th December 2015 (Monday) to pass the results of all Undergraduate Courses, second and final year PG Degree courses [Except 2014-2015 Batch MBA (Full Time) and 2013-2014 Batch & 2014-2015 Batch MBA (Part Time)] for the Term End Examinations held during September / November / December, 2015.

Dr T Santha, Principal, Dr. GRDCS and Chairman, Examination Committee welcomed the members of the Examination Committee. She introduced the University Nominee for the academic year 2015-2016, Dr S Boopathi, Professor of Economics, Bharathiar University to the Members. She briefed the examination and valuation schedule to the members. The Chairman appreciated the work done by the HODs/Directors and COE section staff during the Term End Examinations – September / November / December, 2015.

The Chairman stated the norms of existing moderation (awarding upto 2 marks per subject, subject to a total of not more than 5 marks in all subjects together) being followed for marginal cases of failed students. The Committee *resolved* that the existing moderation practice be followed to enable a pass in the subject/s concerned and that the results be passed accordingly.

The Head of the Departments presented the tabulated marks of their respective departments of the UG, PG Degree and PG Diploma courses before the members.

The Chairman informed the members about a case of malpractice noted during the regular Term End Examinations by the invigilator. The evidentiary documents relating to the malpractice [the confession letter given by the perpetrators, report of malpractices submitted by the concerned invigilator, details of malpractice recorded by the COE section, the answer scripts and Apple i-watch possessing answer contents) was placed on the table. After scrutinizing the performance of the student involved in malpractice, the members suggested to cancel only the particular subject for the student for which the malpractice was recorded.
