The Examination Committee of the College met on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2016 (Monday) to pass the results of UG, second and final year PG Courses (Except MBA Full Time & MBA Part Time) for the Term End Examinations held during November / December, 2016.

Dr T Santha, Principal, Dr. GRDCS and Chairman, Examination Committee welcomed the members of the Examination Committee. She briefed the examination and valuation schedule to the members. The Chairman appreciated the work done by the HODs/Directors and COE section staff during the Term End Examinations – November / December, 2016.

The Chairman stated the norms of existing moderation (awarding upto 2 marks per subject, subject to a total of not more than 5 marks in all subjects together) being followed for marginal cases of failed students. The Committee <u>resolved</u> that the existing moderation practice be followed to enable a pass in the subject/s concerned and that the results be passed accordingly.

The Head of the Departments presented the tabulated marks of their respective departments of the UG, second and final year PG Degree courses before the members.

The Chairman informed the members about the cases of malpractice noted during the regular Term End Examinations by the invigilator and squad members. The evidentiary documents relating to the malpractice [the confession letter given by the perpetrators, report of malpractices submitted by the concerned invigilators / squad members, details of malpractice recorded by the COE section, the answer scripts and incriminating material (bit papers with answer content)] were placed on the table. After scrutinizing the performance of the students involved in malpractice, the members suggested to cancel only the particular subject for the students for which the malpractice was recorded.

After discussion it was <u>resolved</u> that the particular examination (in which malpractice was involved) taken by the students with register numbers 14BBA006, 14BBA007, 15BCE014, 15BCA086) during the November / December, 2016, TEE be cancelled.

The Chairman putforth the members that two students Aishwarya (14BC0004) and Akshay Kumar (14BC0005) were found discussing the answers in the examination hall. The University Nominee suggested that if it is first time, the students should be warned. Members agreed his suggestion and, it was <u>resolved</u> that the students should produce apology letter.

The Chairman informed the members that, despite the warnings given / displayed in the notice board regarding the violation of examination rules one student, Keerthan M P (15BCE028) had brought his smart watch inside the examination hall. Based on the decision made by the members unanimously, it was <u>resolved</u> that a fine of Rs.1,000 be imposed.

The Chairman putforth the results of the outgone students to the committee and stated that 13 students are in short of three to five marks in a subject to complete the degree. She also quoted that the existing special moderation provision for the outgone / outgoing students who were not able to complete their degree due to arrears of one / two subjects and that such students may be given moderation upto five marks for maximum of two failed subjects provided that such moderation would enable clearing of all subjects and qualifying for the degree. The committee accepted the suggestions and <u>resolved</u> that this provision of moderation be effected in the relevant cases only and the results passed accordingly.

The Chairman placed the results of the two students who required nine marks moderation who wrote their arrear exams several times and unable to clear the subjects. The members accepted to give moderation to the two students and <u>resolved</u> that this provision of moderation be effected in the relevant cases upto 9 marks per student and the results passed accordingly.

She also requested that the students may be provided 6 marks moderation to qualify for their degree. The committee accepted the suggestions and <u>resolved</u> that provision of six marks moderation be effected in the relevant cases and the results passed accordingly.
